2013 Annual Spring Traffic Hearing Results

The Provincetown Board of Selectmen held a public hearing on **Tuesday, March 12, 2013 at 6 p.m.** in the Judge Welsh Hearing Room, Town Hall 260 Commercial St., Provincetown, Massachusetts 02657 and then and there approved the following proposals:

Citizens Proposals

1. Develop street sweeping zones for all town owned streets each week requiring vehicles to be moved on a regular basis for street sweeping with a target date of June 1, 2013.
2. Install a "DO NOT ENTER" sign to prevent south bound traffic on Standish Street; enhance signage on the road; and consider planters and the intersection of Bradford to help define the travel lane.
3. Install a "CAUTION CHILDREN" sign on Pleasant Street just prior to the Franklin intersection; installation of a "STOP" sign at the corner of Snow Lane and Franklin Street; recommend hedges be trimmed at the stop sign at Race Road and Franklin Street.
4. Have the Police Department step-up enforcement for vehicles illegally parked on corners and cars parked obstructing emergency access.

STAFF PROPOSALS

1. Increase the cost of a Jerome Smith Weekly Parking Permit from \$40 to \$50.
2. Charge a \$5 fee for the cost of each Seasonal Work Parking Permit (Contractor's Permit for Commercial Street).
3. Raise the eligible age for a senior parking permit from 59 to 65; and further to phase this in over a period of 9 years as follows: Effective 1/1/2014 Age 61 or older; Effective 1/1/2016 Age 62 or older; Effective 1/1/2018 Age 63 or older; Effective 1/1/2020 Age 64 or older; Effective 1/1/2022 Age 65 or older.
4. Install one "15 minute Parking Zone" sign at 378 Commercial Street (just East of Pearl Street).
5. Install a "Caution Children" sign on Shank Painter Road adjacent to 90 Shank Painter Road.
6. Remove the first parking space on Center Street at the corner of Commercial Street to install a bike rack for use by library patrons and the general public.
7. Designate "No Right Turn" from Commercial Street on to Center Street. The street will remain two-way travel for residents of the street.
