He would like to join the VSB as the Arts representative because he feels he could use his experience to reach out and broadend reach in the community. The Board and Mr. Wilson discussed his background as it related to the Arts positions and how he felt he could contribute to the VSB.

Chris Busa, has been publishing the Provincetown Arts magazine for 35 years. Mr. Busa applied for the Arts representative because he felt his years of experience dealing with national advertising and writers for the Provincetown Arts Magazine could assist the VSB. The Board and Mr. Busa dicussed how he might contribute to the Board.

Daniel Llata , year round resident for 14 years, applied for the Arts representative as he feels he is able to bring a very diverse background and experience to the VSB. The Board and Mr. Llata discussed some of the projects he has been involved with in town and how he might contribute to the VSB.
