Working group Update:

A) Cathy Nagorski discusses what took place at the last working group meeting. The group was able to finalize their mission statement for the park. They were also able to see the consultant schedule. The group is fairly optimistic giving a timeline of 7-8 months. Discussion of the use of a Gift Fund for the park was also talked about.

New Business:

- A) Facility Use Application from FLAG: A New Flag Football association; FLAG has reached out in hopes of using Motta field for a tournament in November. Discussion of event and what will be needed is discussed.

Old Business:

- A) 387 Commercial St, interim facility use form: The committee looks over the guidelines that will be put into place for the park. One of the guideline's that was thoroughly discussed during the meeting was what area/s of the park will be designated for event usage vs. Public access. The committee measured the park out and decided that an area of approximately 6100 sq. ft. could be used during the interim period for renters. However, when applications are submitted a layout of what you would like in the area must be submitted as well.

Director's Report:

- A) Fall Sports: Brandon starts the conversation by informing the commission of how successful the Challenger Soccer Program was. The numbers were there and all the children who participated enjoyed it very much. Brandon also talks about the new program that will begin this upcoming Saturday for the little ones. Recreation has hired Soccer Super Stars to come and teach children ages 3-6 yrs. the basics of soccer. In terms of the older kids, he is struggling to have the number for the 5th and 6th graders. He will be in touch with Truro to see what their numbers are in hopes of combining and making a team.

Assistant Director's Report:

- A) Summer Program: Just wrapped up the summer program. The program averaged about 60 children per day, but had over one hundred enrolled throughout the summer. This summer was good; however, the Recreation Dept. is always looking for helpful feedback. Caroline states that her and Brandon put out an online survey for parents and their children to complete. It consisted of 8 multiple choice questions and a couple open ended. Caroline states they have received about 15 responses.
