



Provincetown Beautification Committee

MINUTES

Thursday, February 3, 2011, 2pm Conference Room, Town Hall

Present: Paul Hall, Mary Ann Powers, Todd Westrick, Barbara Rushmore, Ghee Patrick & David Gardner. Sheila LaMontagne was excused. Cecilia Hall is not able to continue as alternate member of the Committee.

The meeting was called to order at 2:00pm.

Mary Ann Powers moved and Barbara Rushmore seconded to accept the Minutes of 1-6-11.

The Gift Fund balance remains at \$5486.12. The bill for the signs at the Waterfront Park have not been paid yet. David Gardner reports that the Visitor Services Board (VSB) has appropriated \$9000 to the Beautification Committee, of which \$5000 is for Waterfront Park planting. Waterfront Park trees to be ordered as replacements will be paid from this fund.

There is a Fisherman's Memorial Committee, headed by Carol Peters (508-487-6403, P.O. Box 1629, 02657). They want a waterfront locale for a memorial statue. Paul Hall will speak to them.

Todd Westrick discussed underplanting on the Waterfront Park, mentioning Vitex, Tamarisk, and Juniper. ~~He will bring plans to the next meeting.~~ *passed as an amendment*

Barbara Rushmore to check with the Water Dept. re: water at the Waterfront Park.

Paul Hall would like to see low lighting at the park and will speak to the Harbormaster to get information about the low lighting on MacMillan Pier.

Todd Westrick was given the rough measurements of six traffic islands and we spoke about the need for a plan for the Grace Hall slope to Bradford Street.

Barbara Rushmore is to talk to the Crowne Pointe people about the Prince Street planting after a priority list of islands to be approved has been decided at the next meeting.

Paul Hall will post a meeting the 3rd week in March, after the 16th.

A check for \$16,875 was bequeathed to the Provincetown Beautification Committee on January 11, 2011 from the Estate of Neil R. Toille, who had lived here.

Paul Hall moved, Mary Ann Powers seconded, to adjourn at 3:40.
