Ms. Murphy appeared to request a recommendation for the renovation of windows and doors at the FAWC barn.
Stephen Borkowski reminded those present that he sits on the Board of Advisors, FAWC.
Stephen Milkowicz is an abutter to the property.
Polly Brunell is on the Visual Committee of FAWC.
The Commission recommends the windows to be six over six single glazes with exterior storm windows.
The center window of the second floor is to be a one over one with eyebrow of custom size.
The center door on the first floor is to be an interior wood door of full light glass with vertical panels.
The west front door is to be a vertical board door with 2/3 small window lights.
The side doors are to be clad doors similar to that of the central lower door. The storm doors are to be full view glass and in red. Second choice color is black.

Mick Rudd, Library Trustees
Mr. Rudd approached the Commission with the need to develop a process based on Mass. Gen. Laws with regard to the placement of memorials on Town property, specifically the Library.
The Library Board has questions as to the control of the Library grounds regarding the placement of the planned AIDS Memorial.
The Cultural Council has taken on the project of the memorial.
The Art Commission has the purview over design approval. The Historic District Commission has jurisdiction of the placing of monuments include in its by-laws.
It is suggested that the Library Board first needs to clarify rights of the land with Town Council.
